Description:

Due to the nature of the cardiac surgery, the surgeon needs to work on a still heart, and it is necessary to temporarily replace the patient's circulatory and respiratory function. It is the responsibility of the perfusionist, a specialized healthcare professional, to assume the function of the heart and/or lungs during these medical procedures. Operating the Heart-Lung Machine, a perfusionist spends 90% of their time in the in the OR suite but their role is beginning to be associated with the Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (CIVICU).
